Robins are one of the most recognisable garden birds. Listen out for their lovely melodic song!



Blue Tits are social, often in mixed flocks. Females pick mates for bright blue head feathers.




Blackbirds are first and last to sing daily. Males are black with bright yellow/orange beaks.



Starlings are glossy black birds with a sheen of purple and green, and are often seen in flocks.



House Sparrows have grey heads like roofs unlike Tree Sparrows that have brown heads like tree trunks.



Woodpigeons are the most common pigeon, recognisable by grey plumage with white wing and neck patches.
